However, once you have completed and submitted the questionnaire, it will be impossible to delete the data since no information to identify the participants has been collected.

Confidentiality, sharing, monitoring and publications

During your participation in this research project, the research director will collect and record the responses and other information you provide in a research file. Only information needed to properly conduct the research project will be collected. It may include the following information: your sex/gender and teaching level (elementary, secondary, 1st, 2nd, 3rd cycle). No other personal information is requested or collected.
